- umpire, etc...



Distribution and recent evolution of management and professionals



### 3 missions for French sports


#### For sailing:

2 millions participants
1 300 Clubs
250 000 FFVoile permit-holders
200 000 novices / year
5 000 competitions.
5 000 directors
3 700 volunteer executives (partial time # 1500 full time)
1 300 technical managers
250 High-Level participants (elite)

#### **Means of Governance**






#### **Finance**

VAT on Sailing equipment = Public financing of organized sports



- Budget of Sports Ministry (less than 1% of National budget)

  - + Budget of local government
